

Payment Policies

- In order to reserve your spot, your application must be submitted with a copy of your paid deposit slip of \$500. You are not considered an applicant of the program until both pieces are submitted.
- If the \$500 deposit is paid after the initial deadline, of December 15, 2009, you will be charged the **\$100 late fee**. January 15th for the Mexico program.
- Installment payments in the amount of 1/3 of your remaining balance will be due February 15th, March 15th and April 15th. The balance of all program costs is due by **April 15, 2010**.
- All deposits and payments must be submitted to the Student Cashier's Office, Coronna Hall, 1st Floor, P.O. Box 44444, Lafayette, LA 70504, (337) 482-6385.
- The cost of the program is charged to your student account. Any outstanding debt from program costs and/or damages will result in a hold being placed on your student account and/or disciplinary action from the Dean of Students Office.
- In the event of an unexpected change in currency exchange rates, and prior to May 1, 2010, an exchange rate surcharge may be necessary.

Refund Policy

- This special program does **not** operate under the standard UL Lafayette refund policy.
- **No refunds will be granted after January 15, 2010.**
- Other amounts may be lost depending on when the student withdraws if monies have been paid to host institutions, insurance companies, or for prepaid activities.

Academic Requirements

- We strongly recommend that you meet with your advisor to make sure that the courses you select will be useful within your curriculum. Because the Study Abroad Committee will make program and instructor decisions in February, you must check with your advisor about summer courses during the fall advising period. Course changes will not be allowed after February 15th.
- In order to participate in any program, students must be in good academic standing with the University, not on academic suspension.
- The Study Abroad Office will schedule your courses in the ISIS system on behalf of the students. Classes cannot be scheduled if there are holds on your account, so please handle any holds.
- All paperwork must be completed and submitted prior to departure in order to participate in the program. Failure to do so will result in loss of Study Abroad academic credit.
- Students pursuing a degree at UL Lafayette are allowed to take a maximum of 6 hours of Humanities (HUMN) credit at the 200 level, 6 hours at the 300 level and 6 hours at the 400 level. Any additional HUMN credits earned will not be applied toward your degree.
- **Non-UL Lafayette students** must apply for admission to the University as a non-degree seeking student with an academic major of summer visitor.

Cost and Expenses by Program

Registration Deadline for All Programs – March 1, 2010

LONDON, ENGLAND – May 31 – June 4 (Lafayette), June 7 – 22 (England)

Program costs include: bed and breakfast at a London hotel, tuition, insurance, museums, entrance fees, field trips, public transportation passes and complimentary wireless for student laptops. **Airfare is not included** and must be purchased by the student.

Registration and Deposit **before** December 15, 2009: **\$3200**

Registration and Deposit **after** December 15, 2009: **\$3300**

Costs **do not include** such items as: airfare to London, passport fees, ISIC card, laundry and telephone costs, public access to the internet, lodging while traveling, meals other than those specified, and items of a personal nature. We strongly recommend the purchase of trip cancellation insurance in case of emergencies.

PARIS, FRANCE – May 28 – July 10, 2010

Program costs include: room and 2/3 board, tuition, insurance, museums, entrance fees, field trips, and public transportation passes. **Airfare is not included** and must be purchased by the student.

Registration and Deposit **before** December 15, 2009: **\$5900**

Registration and Deposit **after** December 15, 2009: **\$6000**

Costs **do not include** such items as: airfare to Paris, passport fees, ISIC card, Eurail pass, laundry, telephone and internet costs, lodging while traveling, meals other than those specified, and items of a personal nature. We strongly recommend the purchase of trip cancellation insurance in case of emergencies.

FLORENCE, ITALY – May 26 – July 7, 2010

Program costs include: **round-trip airfare**, room, tuition, insurance, museums and entrance fees, guided tours and field trips including a four day excursion in Rome.

Registration and Deposit **before** December 15, 2009: **\$6800**

Registration and Deposit **after** December 15, 2009: **\$6900**

Costs **do not include** such items as: passport fees, Eurail pass, laundry, telephone and internet costs, lodging and transportation while traveling on your own, meals, and items of a personal nature. **Students will be responsible for any additional government imposed taxes, security charges or fuel surcharges on the airline ticket, if imposed by the airlines.** Typically, this has rarely occurred but each person is liable for any increase.

MEXICO CITY, MEXICO – June 14 – July 2 (Lafayette), July 5 – 26 (Mexico)

Program costs include: **round-trip airfare**, lodging in Mexico City and on group travel outside the city, museum entry fees visited as a group, tuition and public transportation.

Registration and Deposit **before** January 15, 2010: **\$3300**

Registration and Deposit **after** January 15, 2010: **\$3400**

Costs **do not include** such items as: passport fees, ISIC card, laundry, telephone and internet costs, lodging while traveling (beyond the group travel), recommended tipping at the hotel, meals and items of a personal nature. **Students will be responsible for any additional government imposed taxes, security charges or fuel surcharges on the airline ticket, if imposed by the airlines.** Typically, this has rarely occurred but each person is liable for any increase.
